Parent Survey

Thank you to everyone who completed the parent survey last term. One of the issues raised from this was behaviour – particularly low level disruption affecting children in lessons. The staff have already discussed this and are looking to introduce a new behaviour system to begin after February half-term. We will be talking to the children to collect their views on what behaviour they think deserves rewards or sanctions (and what they should be). Once we have had the children's input, we will share the new policy with you. For now, weekly behaviour scores will continue and we will start the new system after February half-term. However, see below for one change we are making straight away...

House Teams

Every child is allocated to one of our four house teams when they join the school:

Danes - Green
Romans - Red
Saxons - Blue
Vikings - Yellow

In Key Stage 2, this allows children of all abilities to participate in competitive but friendly sports matches and it enables our oldest pupils to demonstrate their maturity and leadership qualities as they are responsible for organising teams and ensuring that they are fair to all House Team Members. We also want our House Captains to promote positive behaviour, exemplify our school values (kindness, honesty and respect) and act as role models to the younger children. Whenever adults are impressed with our pupils' work or behaviour, they will reward them with House Points. Each week, House Captains will add up all the points and the highest scoring team be celebrated in sharing assembly. Children will also keep track of the points they have received themselves, working towards bronze, silver and gold awards. This will replace all current in-class behaviour systems (e.g. dojos, merits) and ensure that children are rewarded in the same way across the school.

Spelling BIF

Our current school improvement focus is on spelling and before the holidays you should have received information about ways of supporting your child with their spelling at home. Further copies are available on our school website.

One of the main things which you can do to help your child with their spelling is to read regularly with them, taking note of any words that they may not know. Our Mundford Junctions this half-term will have a focus on how to do this effectively, along with some other fun ways of improving spelling. We hope to see you there.

The children have had the idea of holding a bring and buy sale – where they could all bring in unwanted toys, games and books for others to buy. Each class could then spend any money raised on equipment for their classrooms. We will be holding this on Friday 1st February in the hall from 8:45 – 9:15. After Christmas we know the children have lots of new things, so it might be a good time to sort through and decide what unwanted items they don't want any more. We will be collecting donations of toys, games & books from Mon 28th – Thurs 31st Jan. Thanks

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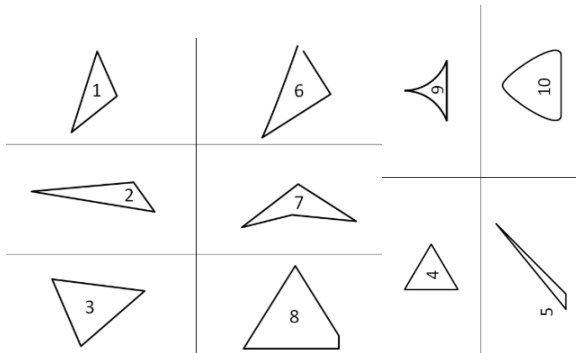
Maths Problems of the Month

Catrina wants to know how many football cards she has collected. She has filled up five pages of her scrapbook and on each page there are four cards.

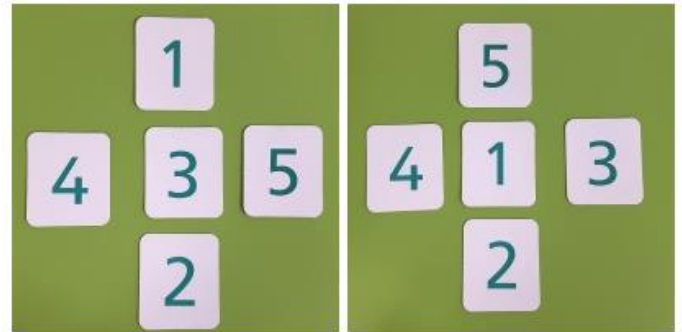
Can you show how you would find out? You might draw a picture or do some jottings or a number sentence.

Here are some shapes:



Which is a triangle?
Which are not triangles?
How do you know?

KS2



What do you notice about the two crosses?
What is the same?
What is different?

Both crosses use the digits 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5. The left cross has a horizontal total of 12 and a vertical total of 6. The right cross has a horizontal total of 8 and a vertical total of 8.

We call the cross on the right a *magic cross*, because its horizontal total is equal to its vertical total.

Can you find any more magic crosses using the digits 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5?

Can you find all the possibilities?

Can you convince yourself you have found them all?
