There will be a separate post with some optional ideas for you to look at on our Facebook page, alternatively, why not search for some unique ideas on the internet!

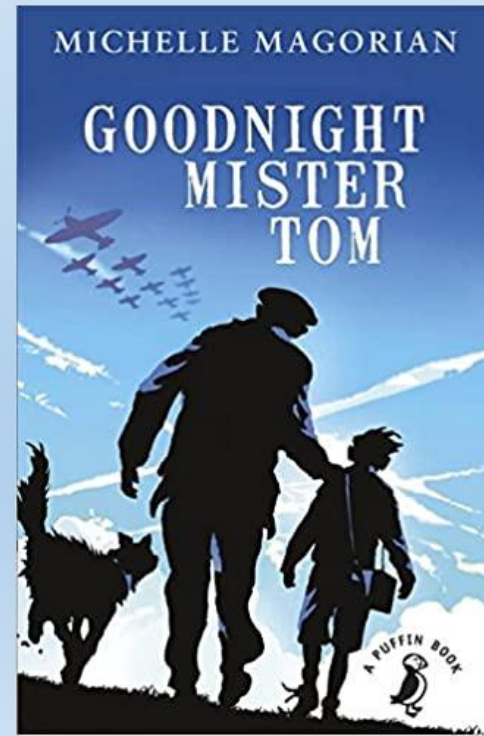

Maths- Converting times into 24hrs.

Maths

L.O: To convert times to the 24hr clock.

Challenge of the week linked to our Maths topic: Can someone time you doing an exercise of your choice? Daily mile around the garden, 20 star jumps... Can you get quicker throughout the week? How will you know if you have become quicker? Can you work out how much quicker?

Wednesday:

Go back to your diary you kept yesterday of the different times you completed activities throughout the day.

Can you have a go at converting these times into the 24 hour clock?
