

#### Top proofreading tips

- Once your story is finished, read it to yourself.
- Pretend that someone else wrote the story, see how well you think the story is written and then rewrite it to make it better.
- Use conjunctions to make sure your sentences flow nicely and make sense.
- Double-check your facts.
- Look out for spelling, grammar and punctuation mistakes.
- Look for words or sentences that you can make better by choosing different vocabulary, adding description or adding adverbs.

Read the proofreading tips above - then if you would like an extra challenge, try to use the tips to edit and improve the following diary entries. Diary entry 1 has lots of spelling, grammar and punctuation mistakes. Diary entry 2 is okay but could do with a bit more interest and description adding. Can you rewrite them to make them better?

Can you find a way to recreate this famous Japanese painting called 'The Great Wave off Kanagawa' by Hokusai?






Calligraphy (shodo) is one of the most admired Japanese arts. Can you practice some calligraphy using a paintbrush and black ink/paint?








### **ART IDEAS CONTINUED**
