Owls & Goslings

This week in Owls & Goslings, the children enjoyed SAW day exploring changing states of matter. We investigated how liquids turn to solids and tested them by putting them in the freezer, making predictions about which would freeze. We also made fruit smoothies and ice cream. We have answered Imogen and Rosie's questions about frogs and tadpoles in our science learning. In the woodland, we have enjoyed hammering flowers into cotton and learned how to use a Rekenrek in maths to support subitising and counting.

Skularks

This week in Skylarks, we have been learning to tell the time past the hour and to tell the time to the hour. We made clocks out of natural materials in Y1, while Y2 and 3 investigated the intervals around a clockface counting in multiples of 5. We had our SAW day where we learned about different types of fossil, making our own mould and trace fossils and writing haikus. This was harder than we thought when we first heard it was a 3 line poem! We clapped out the syllables in each line to ensure we got the 5-7-5 pattern correct. We have also been architects in our history lesson, designing our own Roman towns with specific purposes, such as to be a centre of defence or a hub of entertainment.

Kestrels

This week in Kestrels, we had our No Plan Day where the children decided to learn about Korea. They found out many facts about the two countries which were incredibly interesting and researched lots of different things such as Korean sports such as Tae Kwon Do and Korean food. In the afternoon, we had the opportunity to learn some Tae Kwon Do from our resident experts Max, Ellie and Paloma and then we tried some Korean food: stir fry, kim chi and Korean garlic bread which has sweetened bread and sweet cream cheese. It was delicious!
