

Time and Statistics




We will also continue mastering number maths meetings in Y1 and 2 and arithmetic practice in Y3.

Science

We will identify and classify, compare and research to find out all about the ground beneath our feet. We will also have a SAW day on fantastic fossils!



History and Geography

We will find out what Roman buildings were like and how they laid out their towns. We will discover a box of Roman artefacts and uncover the stories behind them.

In **Geography** we will explore Italy, comparing Naples and Norwich and discover what happens when a volcano erupts!
