upil Information

ransition

- Home and nursery visits will happen on Monday 8th, Tuesday 9th, Wednesday 10th a Thursday 11th of July.
- School transition visits will happen on Friday 12th July, and all week commencing Monday 15th July.
- Children are invited to come to school and stay all day, as they will in September. The doors open between 8.40am -8.50am, and home time is 3.20pm.
- Children can either bring a packed lunch or order a hot meal. If you are in Acorns, please order and pay for lunches in the usual way. If not, we have paper copies and payments will be added when your child is on the system.

Start date

First day at school will be Wednesday 4th September 2024.

lothing and Possessions

- Please make sure that all belongings are labelled.
- Over the summer holidays encourage your child to practise dressing and undressing independently. Velcro is not a necessity but it really helps build their independence.
- School uniform:
- Children are placed into one of 4 house teams (Red Romans, Blue Saxons, Green Danes or Yellow Vikings). They will need a PE t-shirt in the colour of their team. Their team can be found on the top of the welcome booklet, your child's name is written in their team colour.

landy hint!





Something simple to try that not only helps with name recognition but helps your child to put their shoes on the correct feet. All great to encourage independence. Stick a small piece of masking tape into the bottom of each shoe and then write your child's name across the tape with half of it in the left and half in the right. A good way to reinforce that names start with a capital too.

Attendance and Punctuality

- e school gates open at 8.30am and you go straight through the playground to Oak e door to Oak Class will open at 8.40am and remain open until 8.50am. If you arri er 8.50am, please report to the school office in the main building;
- u will be greeted by the class teacher at the classroom door;
- ease telephone and inform the school if your child is absent and give the reason;
- infectious illnesses must be reported (e.g. chicken pox, measles, conjunctivitis);
- your child becomes ill during the day we will make contact with you and ask you to me and collect or arrange for another person to collect on your behalf. It is therefo
- ucial that you contact details are up to date.
- kness: if your child has a stomach or sickness bug they must remain at home for 4 urs afterwards.
- your child has a medical condition that requires equipment, for example asthma, pull and you make sure we have a spare pump for school.

earning in Reception

Play is an important part of the daily routine;

Our curriculum allows children to be inquisitive and tackle things they have never encountered before and equips them to learn to manage uncertainties and assess risk;

Children take part in focus groups for English and Maths each week w the teacher and this learning will be recorded in books;

Assessments of the children are carried out through observing them during play;

eading and Phonics

- The children read 1-1 with members of the team each week;
- We also send home 2 books each week for you to read with your child One will be for enjoyment and one will be for the development of phonics;
- We teach children to read using phonics (letters and sounds) which w teach daily. We will hold information and help sessions in the autumn term but check out this website for a quick overview –
